Kjære studenter,

Dear students!

Welcome to the European Integration Summer School 2019!

Established in 1990, this is now our 30th annual European Integration summer school (in short: EISS). The summer school started life well before the University of Agder was founded in 2007 – but more on that when we meet during this summer.

Over the period of three or six weeks – depending on whether you are going to opt for just one or both courses taught during the summer – we are going to study one of the most fascinating and dynamic phenomena in contemporary political life: the European Union. It seems that the process of European integration has run out of steam – at least to some extent – and has now reached a critical juncture facing numerous internal and external challenges. What does this hold for the future political order of the European continent? Does the EU's architecture harness the Union just well enough to adjust to these challenges? Are we perhaps at the brink of an 'ever more differentiated' if not an 'ever looser' (Schimmelfennig and Winzen 2019) European Union after all? These are just some of the questions that we are going to address at the European Integration Summer School in Kristiansand this year (course 2) – a after immersing ourselves in the more foundational aspects of European integration, such as the history, institutions and core policies of the EU (course 1). You will learn about historical and contemporary political processes of European integration that can explain some of the challenges both the EU and Europe are confronted with today.

As you can already see, the European Integration Summer School has been divided into two stand-alone courses during summer, complemented by a third course in the autumn term (August-December 2019). The first course paves the ground by dealing with particular aspects of the 'History, Institutions, and Politics of European Integration' in a broad and generic perspective. The second course – 'Current Issues in the European Union' – builds on the first one and focuses on a more particular topic: this year it explores 'The European Union in Crisis'. Finally, the last course, offered during the fall term this year, is a (primarily) skype- and web-based paper-writing course where you explore any of the topics of one of the two summer courses in more depth.

At the beginning of June, you will have access to the reading material, e.g. via our online teaching tool canvas. In order to prepare for the summer school, we would recommend that you have a look at any of the following books: *John McCormick, Understanding the European Union. A Concise Introduction, Palgrave Macmillan, 2014* or *Michelle Cini and Nieves Pérez-Solórzano Borragán, European Union Politics, Oxford University Press, 2019*.

Although you are likely to be facing a tough summer, we can also promise you a most fruitful and fantastic time in Kristiansand. The 'Sørlandet' region has a reputation as the coolest Côte d'Azur. If the weather is good, we will make use of the beautiful campus at University of Agder, visit the beaches and seaside islands and explore Southern Norway's famous landmark signature 'Preikestolen' – when a hard day's work is over.

Steven Blockmans is Head of EU Foreign Policy at CEPS and Professor of EU External Relations Law and Governance at the University of Amsterdam. He is the author of *The Obsolescence of the European Neighbourhood Policy* (Rowman & Littlefield 2017) and *Tough Love: the EU's relations with the Western Balkans* (Asser Press 2007). He served as rapporteur of Task Forces on *More Union in European Defence* chaired by Javier Solana (2015) and *Re-group and Reform: Towards a More Responsive and Effective European Union* (2017). He has (co-)edited more than 15 volumes, including *The EU's Role in Global Governance* (Oxford University Press 2013) and research handbooks on *EU Institutional Law* (Edward Elgar 2016) and *The EU's Common Foreign and Security Policy* (Edward Elgar 2018).



Alex Brianson is Professorial Fellow at the Global Europe Centre, University of Kent. He held positions at the University of Surrey, Brunel University, the University of Limerick and Queen's University Belfast. He also worked in the European Parliament as Adviser to Ken Collins MEP, the then Chair of the Committee on the Environment, Consumer Protection and Public Health 1996-7. His research interests include comparative regionalism, integration theory, and greening the EU. He also loves dogs, ABBA and Moomins, who regularly insert themselves into his teaching and serve as therapy against Brexit trauma. His latest book, coedited with Malin Stegmann McCallion, is *Nordic States and European Integration: Awkward Partners in the North?* (Palgrave, 2017).



Michele Chang is Professor in the Department of European Political and Governance Studies at the College of Europe since 2006. She has taught at Boston University, American University in Brussels, and Colgate University. Her most recent book is *Economic and Monetary Union* (Palgrave Macmillan 2016), and she authored a monograph on the European Central Bank will be published by Oxford University Press in 2020. She is on the Board of the Trans European Policy Studies Association and previously served on the Executive Board of the European Studies Association (2013-2017).



Stefan Gänzle is Jean Monnet Chair and Professor of Political Science at the Department of Political Science and Management, University of Agder. Previous affiliations include the German Development Institute in Bonn, the University of British Columbia in Vancouver and the University of Jena. He is the author of one book and has co-edited six books or special issues of academic journals. His most recent research has been published in the *Journal of Common Market Studies*, *Journal of European Integration*, *Political Studies Review*, *Public Administration*, and *Regional and Federal Studies*.



Jochen Jungeilges holds a position as Professor of Economics and Econometrics at Agder University (Norway). He teaches statistics/econometrics at the graduate level. In the recent past, he has taught courses on the Economics of European Integration and European Competition Policy at various graduate institutions. His current research portfolio encompasses dynamic economic modelling, econometric work on dynamic binary choice models, and cross-cultural studies of sentiments concerning distributional justice.



Nadja Kühn is Ph.D. Research Fellow at the Department of Political Science and Management at the University of Agder. Her research is primarily in the area of Europeanization of Norwegian national administration and International Public Administration. In 2018, she won the best paper prize (together with Jarle Trondal) of the Norwegian Public Administration Journal (*Norsk Statsvitenskapelig Tidsskrift*). Her publications have appeared in the *Journal of European Public Policy* and the *Journal of International Organizations Studies*.



Benjamin Leruth is Assistant Professor in Politics and Public Administration at the Institute for governance & Policy Analysis, University of Canberra. He holds a PhD in Politics from the University of Edinburgh and previously worked at the University of Bath and the University of Kent. His research interests are Euroscepticism, differentiated integration in the European Union and public attitudes towards governance. He recently co-edited *Euroscepticism as a Transnational and pan-European Phenomenon* (Routledge, 2017), *After Austerity* (Oxford University Press, 2017) and the *Routledge Handbook of Euroscepticism* (2018).



Mark Pollack is a Professor of Political Science and Law and Jean Monnet Chair at Temple University in Philadelphia, where he also serves as Director of Global Studies. He received his Ph.D. from Harvard University, and taught at the University of Wisconsin-Madison and the European University Institute in Florence, Italy before. He is the author of *The Engines of European Integration* (Oxford University Press, 2003), and co-author (with G.C. Shaffer) of *When Cooperation Fails* (Oxford University Press, 2009). He is also editor or co-editor of eight books, including most recently *Interdisciplinary Perspectives on International Law and International Relations* (with J.L. Dunoff, Cambridge University Press, 2013).



Simona Piattoni is Professor of Political Science at the Department Sociology and Social Research, University of Trento (Italy), and a Professor-II at the University of Agder, Kristiansand (Norway). Previously, she has held positions at the University of Innsbruck (Austria) and the University of Tromsø (Norway). Simona Piattoni was Chair of the European Consortium for Political Research (ECPR) and of the Conference Group on Italian Politics and Society. Her research agenda focuses on multi-level governance, EU democracy and political clientelism. She is the author of 'The Theory of Multi-level Governance. Conceptual, Empirical, and Normative Challenges, Oxford University Press 2010.'



Claudio M. Radaelli is Professor of Political Science at the University College of London. A comparative policy analyst, Claudio has published 80 articles and written or edited 17 books and special issues of academic journals. His main fields of specialization include the theory of policy learning, Europeanization, the role of economics in public policy, and regulation. He has also published in the field of research design, including a co-authored book on *Designing Research in the Social Sciences* and a co-edited volume on *Research Design in European Studies: Establishing Causality in Europeanization*.



Ariadna Ripoll Servent has been Assistant Professor of Political Science and European Integration since 2013. She is also visiting professor at the College of Europe in Bruges, where she teaches a course on the European Parliament. Her research focuses on European integration, EU institutions and EU internal security policies (particularly asylum, immigration and data protection). Among her recent publications are the 'Routledge Handbook of Justice and Home Affairs Research' (co-edited with Florian Trauner) and 'The European Parliament' (published in the 'European Union Series' by MacMillan International Higher Education).



Frank Schimmelfennig is Professor of European Politics at ETH Zurich, Center for Comparative and International Studies, and Fellow of the Robert Schuman Center for Advanced Studies, European University Institute, Florence. His research and teaching focuses on international institutions and European integration, with a focus on integration theory, differentiated integration, enlargement and democratization.



Jarle Trondal is Professor of Public Administration and Director of Centre for European Studies at the University of Agder. He also is Adjunct Professor at the Centre for European Studies, University of Oslo (ARENA). His research and teaching activities relate to the EU as a political system, administrative integration and transformation, the EU/EEA and Norway, the European Commission, international executive institutions, EU committee governance, agency governance.
