## WELCOME TO THE UNIVERSITY OF AGDER

We are very happy that you have chosen Norway and Agder for your studies. We hope that you will find the information in this brochure helpful during your first weeks at UiA. In addition to the welcome programme, you will find maps and some practical information to help you get used to your new home.

### YOUR FIRST DAYS

For some of you, several of your first days will be spent in hotel quarantine. During this time you will receive all the information you need to get started and be ready to for your semester at UiA. This includes when to register with the police, registering for classes and answers to all of the practical questions you may have. Members of the Erasmus Student Network (ESN) will introduce you to life in Norway and organise social events both online and physical, depending on the measures in place.

### STUDYING AT UIA

UiA's primary information channel is [www.uia.no/en](https://www.uia.no/en). Here you will find messages, links to the StudentWeb and the Learning Management System, Canvas, practical information, examination information, schedules, an overview of student associations and lots of useful links. Canvas is also used as an information channel by your teachers and study programme coordinators.

Students are expected to read the information online, in Canvas and sent by e-mail. E-mails sent from UiA will go to your UiA e-mail account, not your private e-mail account.

### SEMESTER AND EXAMINATION REGISTRATION

You should already have received an SMS to your mobile phone on how to get access to your UiA e-mail account, Canvas and the StudentWeb. If you have not received this, please contact UiA Help. We will help you with the

semester registration process on the StudentWeb. You must also download the Student ID app to access your semester card after registering. You cannot get access to all of your information in Canvas until you have registered for classes and examinations. If you have any problems with this, please contact the UiA Help.

*Degree-seeking students* (students doing a full degree at UiA) will have to pay the semester fee and approve your individual education plan on StudentWeb before you receive your semester card (in the app).

### ALL students have to register for classes and examinations on StudentWeb by 1 February.

If you miss the deadlines you will not be able to register for exams.

### STUDENT CARD

In addition to the Student ID app, you will need to get a physical student card. You can get your card by using the self-operated photo booths located in Vilhelm Krag's Hall (Kristiansand) or near the main entrance and elevator (Grimstad). To get your student card, you need a valid ID and your Student ID app. You will be asked to create a PIN code when you order the student card in the photo booth. This can be used with your card to get into certain buildings after closing time. The student card also works as your library card and photocopy card for printing, copying and scanning. You can also use your student card and Student ID app to receive special discounts for students throughout Norway.





## RESIDENCE PERMIT

If you are studying in Norway for 3 months or more, you need to apply for a residence permit as a student. The process varies depending on your nationality.

### Students from non EU/EEA countries

If you come from a country outside EU/EEA, you need to apply for a visa/residence permit. This is also called a study permit. You are advised to contact the Norwegian Embassy or Consulate General in your home country for information on how to apply, or check the webpage to the [Norwegian Directorate of Immigration](#). To apply for your visa/residence permit, you need the Letter of Acceptance from the University of Agder. Please note that you have to pay a fee to apply for the visa.

When you have arrived in Norway, you are required to go to the local police to register as soon as possible after you have completed the mandatory quarantine. This meeting will be organized by UiA in cooperation with the local police and you will receive more information about the procedure during orientation.

### Students from EU/EEA countries

EU/EEA students do not have to apply for a residence permit, but they have to register with the police if staying in Norway for more than 3 months. Please [register online](#), either before leaving your home country or as soon as possible after you arrive in Norway.

You are also required to hand in the required documents in person at the local police in Kristiansand. This meeting will be organized by UiA in cooperation with the local police and you will receive more information about the procedure during orientation.

## NATIONAL IDENTITY NUMBER (ID NUMBER)

In Norway, we use identification numbers to identify residents. This number is required by many public and private sectors to gain access to their services. Most students staying in Norway for less than six months do not need a National Identity Number, but if you would like to work or open a bank account you will need one.

**Non-EU/EEA students** will receive a letter from the Tax Administration with your national identity number or your d-number after you have been to the police to order your residence card. The police will notify the Norwegian Tax Administration that you have been granted a residence permit and they will generate the number for you.

**EU/EEA students** must go to the Tax Administration Office (Skatteetaten) in Kristiansand or Grimstad after registering with the police to report that you are relocating to Norway.

You will need to book an appointment and complete the form "Notification of relocation to Norway from abroad". Please see [Norwegian Tax Administration website](#) for the form and for information on what documents you need to bring.

When your relocation has been correctly reported, you will automatically receive a National ID number within 2-3 weeks.

## HEALTH AND INSURANCE

You must be insured while you are in Norway. European students must bring a valid European Health Insurance Card (EHIC), obtainable in their own home countries, which entitles them to medical care under the Norwegian National Health Scheme. Expenses related to dental care and illnesses contracted before arrival in Norway are not covered. Students from outside of Europe will need proof of insurance from their home countries in order to register with the police, and to apply for reimbursement after receiving Norwegian health service.

However, as a student in Norway you may also apply for voluntary membership in the Norwegian National Insurance Scheme on arrival in Norway. More information can be found on the website for the [Norwegian National Insurance Scheme](#).

## SPECIAL NEEDS

UiA has several resources available if you have special needs. In Kristiansand, the Office for Students with Special Needs is located in Sigrund Undsets Hus, building 50, Gimlemoen. In Grimstad it is located on the fifth floor (room C5 068).

## SPECIAL EXAMINATION ARRANGEMENTS

## CANVAS

Canvas is the Learning Management System used at UiA. In order to get all of the necessary information about your classes through Canvas, you must register for classes and examinations. We recommend that you do this as soon as possible after arrival.

## UIA HELP

UiA Help is your first point of contact for the library, IT services, timetables, admission and examinations. It is possible to reserve certain rooms (videoconferencing, multimedia, etc.) and equipment (cameras, projectors, etc.) through IT-Services.

## Obligatory Health Check for Non-Eu/EEA students:

Students from countries with a high occurrence of tuberculosis are obliged to undergo tuberculosis testing if they are staying longer than three months in Norway. The test is carried out through chest x-rays.

An email will be sent to the students who requires a health check.

## REGISTRATION WITH THE POLICE

### Non EU students:

Make sure you have applied for residence permit and paid the application fee here: [www.udi.no](http://www.udi.no)

Make sure you have filled in the whole application online before you go to the police. Bring along copies and original application documentation as shown in the checklist from UDI. Print the checklist and bring along to the appointment with the police.

If you have applied for a residence permit from your home country, the police will issue your residence card.

If you have NOT applied for residence permit, you must book an appointment and choose first available appointment at [www.udi.no/en/want-to-apply/studies/](http://www.udi.no/en/want-to-apply/studies/). In this case you do **NOT** meet on day as listed below.

### EU/EEA students:

You must register on this site first: <https://selfservice.udi.no/en-gb/>

Make sure you have completed the online registration before you go to the police. You do not have to book an appointment. Bring along a copy of your passport or your national ID-card (the information page) in colours, your insurance policy or your European Health Insurance card, your letter of acceptance, your passport/national ID card and a confirmation from your home university that you are part of the Erasmus+ programme.

### Appointments at the police station:

The appointments will be organised by UiA in collaboration with the police. You will be advised via email when and where to meet.

You do not need to book an appointment.

### The Buddy Programme

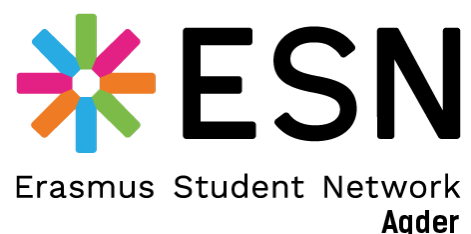

### 1. USERNAME, PASSWORD AND E-MAIL

You should already have received an SMS to your mobile phone on how to get access to your UiA e-mail account, Canvas and the StudentWeb. If not, please contact UiA Help.



### 2. STUDENT ID CARD

You must download the Student ID app to access your semester card after registering. Order your student card through the self-operated photo booths located in Vilhelm Krag's Hall (Kristiansand) and near the main entrance and elevator (Grimstad). The card will be issued within three to four working days at UiA Help. Remember to bring an ID.



### 3. REGISTER

Register for classes and exams on the StudentWeb as soon as possible and before the deadlines (Autumn: 1 September / Spring: 1 February).



### 4. ADDRESS

Register your correct addresses (both home address and Norwegian address) and phone number on StudentWeb.



### 5. CANVAS

Canvas is the Learning Management System at UiA. Canvas is used for online teaching so make sure you are able to log on as soon as possible. Also check your UiA e-mail account at least once a week for important information. Please join our session on Canvas to become familiarised with the platform. 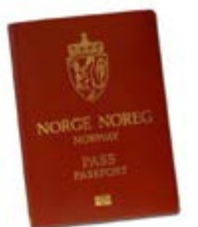
### 6. ONLINE LEARNING AGREEMENT (OLA) (ERASMUS+ STUDENTS ONLY)

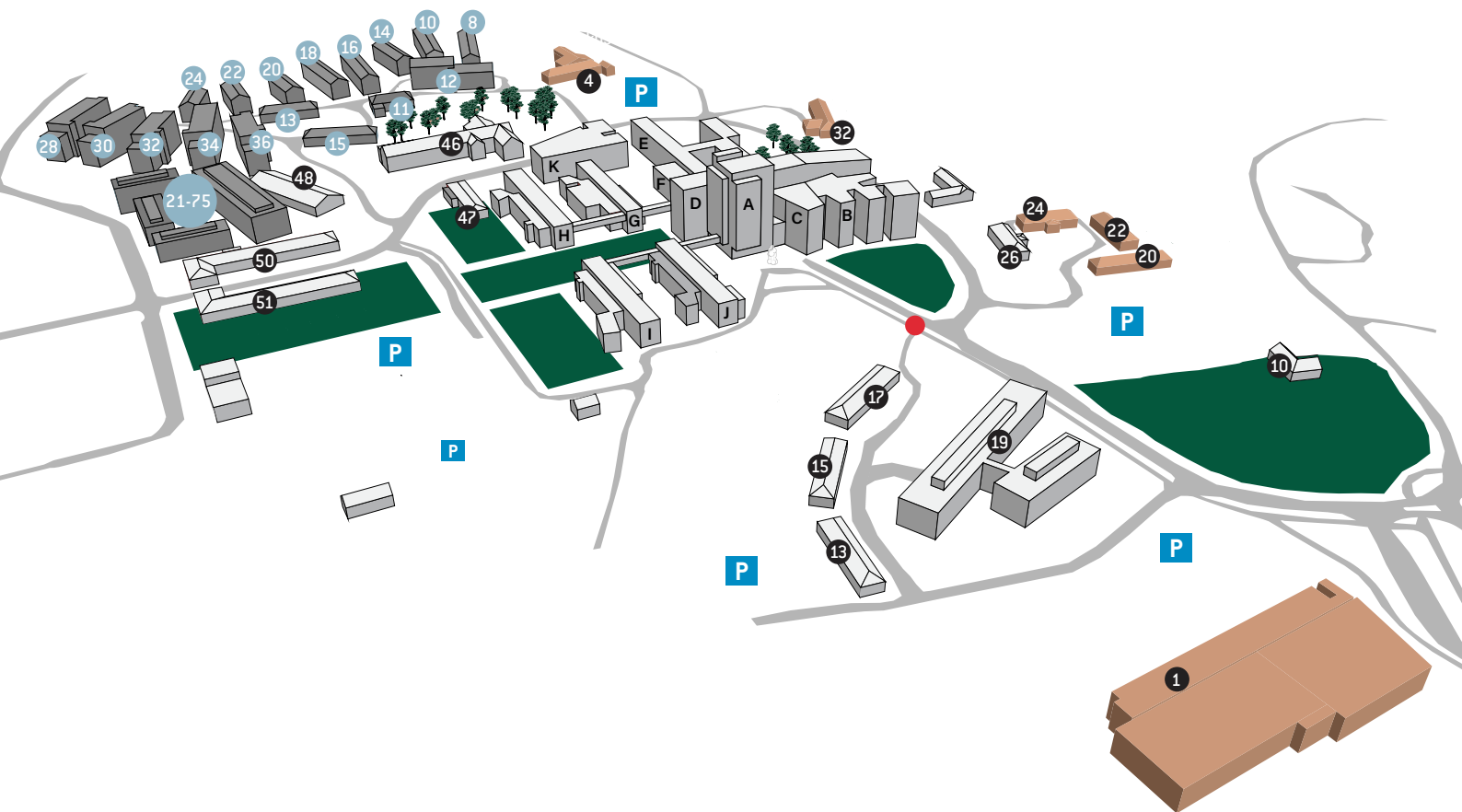

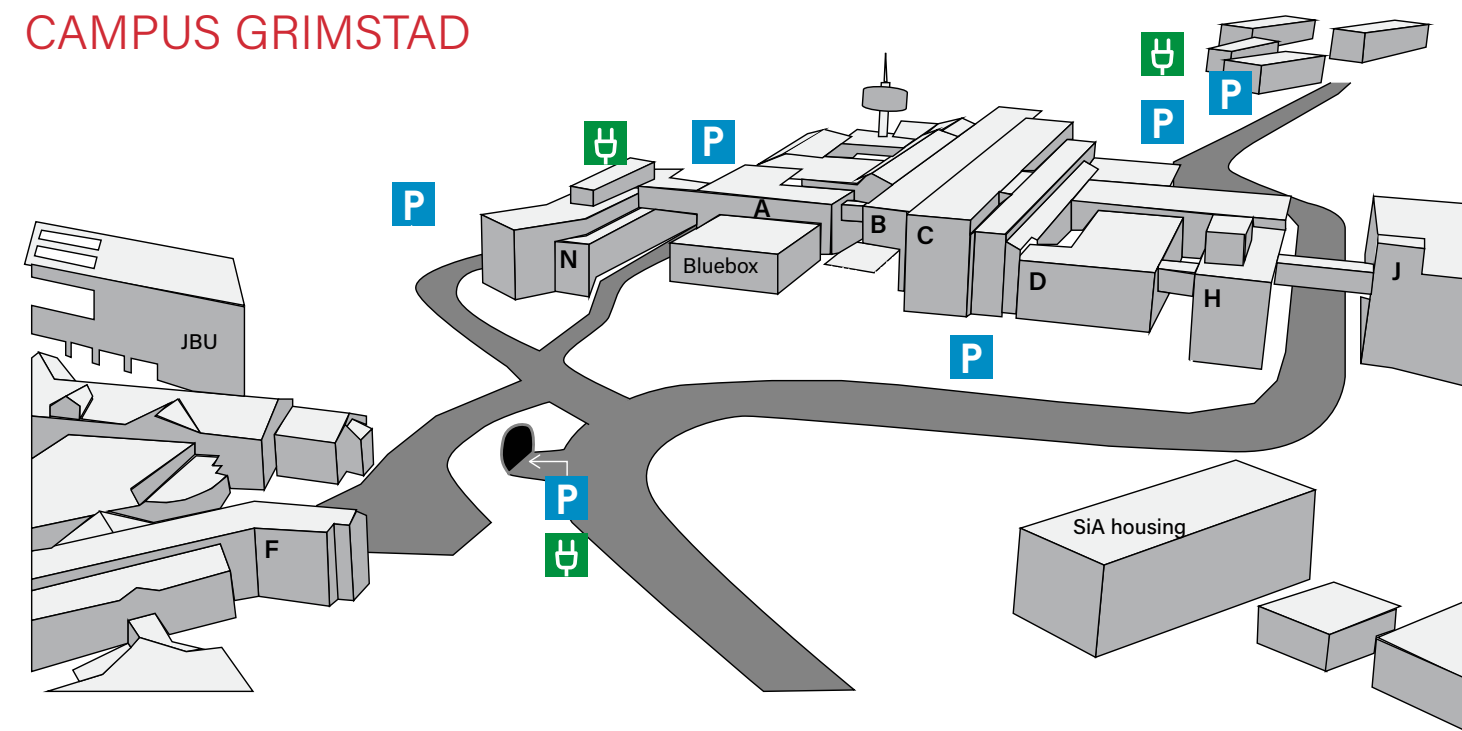
