# **WELCOME TO THE UNIVERSITY OF AGDER**

We are very pleased that you have chosen Norway and Agder for your studies. We hope that you will find the information in this booklet helpful during your first weeks at UiA. In addition to the orientation programme, you will find maps and some practical information to help you get used to your new home.

### YOUR FIRST DAYS

You will receive all the information you need at orientation for international students on 5 January. This includes procedures for registering with the police, registering for classes, and answers to all of the practical questions you may have. Members of the Erasmus Student Network will introduce you to life in Norway and arrange social events the first weekend before the teaching starts.

### STUDYING AT UIA

UiA's primary information channel is www.uia.no/en. You will find messages, links to the StudentWeb and the Learning Management System, Canvas/Fronter, practical information, examination information, schedules, an overview of student associations, and lots of useful links here. Fronter/Canvas is also used as an information channel by your lecturers, professors and study programme coordinators.

Students are expected to read the information online, in Fronter/ Canvas and sent by e-mail. E-mails sent from UiA will go to your UiA e-mail account, not your private e-mail account. Please set up forwarding of your e-mails if desired.

### **SEMESTER AND EXAMINATION REGISTRATION**

At orientation you will receive a username and password for your UiA e-mail account, Fronter/Canvas and the StudentWeb. We will guide you through the semester registration process on the StudentWeb. You must download an app ("Studentbevis") to access your semester card after registering. You cannot get access to all of

your information in Fronter until you have registered for classes and examinations. If you have any problems with this, please contact the Service Centre.

ALL students have to register for classes and examinations on the StudentWeb by 1 February.

If you miss the deadline you will not be able to register for exams!

### STUDENT CARD

In addition to the semester card app, you will have to get a physical student card. You can get your card by using the self-operated photo booths located in Vilhelm Krag's Hall (Kristiansand) or by the Service Centre (Grimstad). To get your student card, you need a valid ID and your semester card. You will receive a PIN that you can use with your card to get into certain buildings after closing time. With the card you can also borrow books, print, copy and scan.

You can also use your student card and semester card to receive special offers for students throughout Norway.

### **RESIDENCE PERMIT**

If you wish to study in Norway for 3 months or more, you need to apply for a residence permit as a student. The process varies depending on your nationality.

### Students from non EU/EEA countries

If you come from a non EU/EEA country you need a visa/residence permit. You are advised to contact the Norwegian Embassy or Consulate General in your home country for information on procedures or check the webpage of the Norwegian Directorate of Immigration: https://www.udi.no/en/want-to-apply/studies/. For the visa/residence permit you need the Letter of Acceptance from the University of Agder. There is a fee connected to the visa process.

If you are a citizen of one of the countries on this list you can apply for a visa (as soon as possible) after your arrival to Norway: https:// www.udi.no/en/word-definitions/persons-who-do-not-need-a-visato-visit-norway-/#link-708. If your nationality is not on the list, you need to apply for a visa to Norway from your home country.

Once in Norway you are required to go to the local police station. More information about the procedure page 7 and 9.

### Students from EU/EEA countries

EU/EEA students do not have to apply for a residence permit, but do have to register with the police if staying in Norway for more than 3 months. Please register online before you leave your home country: https://www.udi.no/en/want-to-apply/the-registration-scheme-foreueea-nationals/

Once in Norway you are required to go to the local police station. More information about the procedure page 7 and 9.

### **NORWEGIAN ID NUMBER**

Most students do not need a Norwegian ID number, but if you would like to work or open a bank account you may apply for one at the Population Registry in Kristiansand or Arendal. Kristiansand: Kjøita 42; Arendal: Friergangen 4

### **HEALTH AND INSURANCE**

You must be insured while you are in Norway. European students should order a European Health Insurance Card. You will then be treated as a Norwegian citizen when seeking health services. Students from outside of Europe will need proof of insurance from their home countries in order to register with the police, and to apply for reimbursement after receiving Norwegian health services.

### **SPECIAL NEEDS**

UiA has several resources available if you have special needs. In Kristiansand, the Office for Students with Special Needs is located in Sigrid Undsets Hus, building 50, Gimlemoen. Opening hours 10:00-14:00. In Grimstad it is located on the fifth floor (room C5 068).

### **CANVAS AND FRONTER**

Fronter/Canvas is the Learning Management System used at UiA. In order to get all of the necessary information about your classes through Fronter, you must register for classes and examinations. We recommend that you do this as soon as possible after arrival.

### SERVICE CENTRE

The Service Centre is one of the first places you will go. Here you will get your arrival/departure form signed, and you may find information about your studies, examinations, admissions, etc. The Service Centre can also organize student counselling.
